Dear Parents and Caregivers

It is with great excitement that we are able to confirm the dates for the Stage 2 Excursion to Borambola this year. We will depart Coolamon on Tuesday 30th October, and return on Wednesday 31st October 2018 (Week 3, Term 4).

Packing checklist:

Please label all clothing, towels and sleeping bag with your child's name.

- Shorts and t-shirts (no singlets, sleeveless or midriff tops)
- **Jeans**
- Jumpers and tracksuit pants
- Socks and underwear
- Raincoat
- **Pyjamas**
- Swimming costume and rash shirt
- Sunscreen, sunhat and sunglasses
- Toiletries, including soap (no aerosols)
- Two towels
- Pillowcase, sleeping bag or sheets (single bed)
- Day-backpack
- Two pairs of sneakers (one old pair to wear in the water)
- Paper, pens or pencils
- Plastic bags for dirty or wet clothes
- Handkerchief or tissues
- Water bottle.

Optional: camera, preferably disposable

What not to bring to camp:

- Aerosol cans (e.g. spray on deodorant or insect repellent)
- Thongs, Ugg boots or slippers (these cannot be worn around the Centre or on activities)
- Radios, iPod's, MP3 players, computer/video games, mobile phones, lollies or chewing gum, jewellery or anything valuable.

One travelling case/bag and a sleeping bag are allowed per child and should be clearly marked with your child's name, address and phone number. Remember, your child will have to carry their luggage, so make sure it's not too big or too heavy.

Medical information

All medicines should be in original packaging and clearly marked with your child's name, together with instructions on the prescribed dosage and frequency. You may also discuss this with your child's teacher, who will be responsible for making sure your child takes their medication. This may be done and given to the teacher the morning of departure.

Asthma

If your child has been diagnosed by a doctor as having asthma, you must provide an asthma management plan so staff are aware of what action to take in the event of an attack. This can be downloaded from www.asthmansw.org.au. Children with asthma should bring their own spacer and keep their inhalers with them at all times.

Accidents or emergencies

Description of some activities

(Please note not all activities will be on our itinerary)

At-height Climbing wall

Participants scale a vertical (or near-vertical) wall using artificial climbing holds of different shapes and sizes. Participants, attached via a harness and belay system, can choose the height to which they participate. Concepts of team work are taught with peers working together to maintain the belay system and encourage one another.

Low Ropes

A series of cables and ropes suspended approximately 60cm above the ground. This activity requires two or more peers to work in unison to support and spot a single participant to traverse across each element of the course.

Aquatic: Canoe/kayaking

A fun team experience where participants are taught the concepts and basic techniques behind flat water canoeing and kayaking, including how to manoeuvre and control the craft. Canoes typically require three people to manoeuvre them in the water while kayaks are typically for one.

Bush Bivouac

Participants experience an introduction to camping in tents. Taking place on Centre farmland participants "camp out" and cook over an open fire. This activity is weather dependent.

Nature Walk

An activity which encourages participants to engage with their natural surroundings. It includes information on the surrounding native fauna and flora as well as the history of the local area.

Cookout

Often taking place with a nature walk or a bivouac, learn how to safely prepare a meal over an open fire.

Rogaining

A fun introduction to map reading and navigation without the use of compasses, testing participant's observation skills and awareness of their surrounds.

Archery

Participants are introduced to the correct techniques and safety procedures of archery, the practice of using a recurve bow held to shoot arrows at a static target.

BMX Bikes

An introductory or intermediate bike skills activity. Learn riding techniques, bike maintenance and safety, and road rules.

Indigenous games and boomerangs

An opportunity to learn about, appreciate and experience aspects of Indigenous games, sports and culture.

Fencing

An introduction to the history, swordsmanship skills and etiquette of the modern Olympic sport.

Fishing

Learn about the local marine life and fishing techniques with plenty of time to practise their skills.

Money and valuables

You may wish to provide your child with some spending money so they can buy some camp souvenirs. This is not essential! We suggest that spending money is limited to \$20-\$30. Please note that each student is responsible for their own money.

Accommodation

Students will stay in comfortable rooms, with male and female students accommodated separately. Teachers stay in a room nearby and are responsible for student safety and behaviour overnight.

Meals

Students will need to bring a packed morning tea and lunch in their back packs for Tuesday. Borambola will supply all other meals which are nutritious and prepared by qualified catering staff in a commercial kitchen. Your child's special dietary requirements or food allergies should have been listed on the Medical and consent form. Special diets are provided for medical conditions, religious beliefs and vegetarians/vegans.

Behaviour

For everyone's enjoyment and safety at the camp, Borambola staff expect a high standard of behaviour. Camp rules will be explained to students on arrival. Children who persistently ignore reasonable requests or engage in inappropriate behaviour may be removed. If this happens, Borambola staff will phone you or a nominated contact person to make arrangements for your child to be taken home. If they cannot make contact with anyone within 24 hours, they reserve the right to make alternative arrangements after discussion with the school and other appropriate Government agencies.

Outdoor safety

Every effort is made to ensure your child's safety and comfort while at camp. Borambola have a sun protection policy that supports wearing hats and sunscreen and altering programs to minimise sun exposure during the hottest part of the day. Personal flotation devices (life jackets) are supplied by the Centre and covered shoes must be worn when participating in all water sports, except for swimming.

Transport

Transport will be provided by Allen's Coaches. We will travel in an air-conditioned coach with individual seat belts and a DVD player.

Cost

The total cost for the excursion is **\$195.00** per student. Please note this cost includes all transport, meals (except those specified for the first day of travel), accommodation and activities. The cost does not include spending money. Should students wish to bring their own money to purchase extra food items or souvenirs, this is to be at their own expense. We recommend students bring no more than \$20-\$30 each. Each student is to be responsible for their money.

Payment

To ensure the excursion will go ahead we ask that you **pay a deposit of \$60.00 cash** before the 4th of June 2018 to secure accommodation and lock in our numbers of students attending. Should the excursion be cancelled due to lack of attendees, the \$60.00 will be refunded up until the 4th of June. After the 4th of June, if numbers are secured the \$60 will be non-refundable and you will be asked to pay the balance owing of \$135 (please see optional payment plan details below).

Payment for the Excursion is to be made as follows:

During May \$60 Cash only (after June 4th non-refundable deposit)

Friday 29 June \$50 Thursday 30 August \$50

Monday 24 September \$35 (final payment)

Payment methods are by cash, EFTPOS, POP or Cheque, made payable to Coolamon Central School. Full payment of \$195 cash will also be accepted, should you not wish to follow the payment plan.

Should you wish to organise an alternate payment plan, please make an appointment with Mr Beer at your earliest convenience. We would love to have all of Stage 2 attend.

Please fill in the attached Medical Information Form and return with the permission notes.

Another packing requirement list will be sent home closer to our departure date. Students who have not made total payment by Friday 28th September will be unable to attend the Excursion.

Please complete the attached permission note, contract and medical information form and return it to your child's classroom teacher by Monday 4th June 2018.

Please note: After Friday 28th September 2018 (3 school weeks prior to the excursion) no refunds will be given if your child decides to withdraw from the excursion, as bookings will have been made at Borambola. In addition, your child can only attend this excursion when they have read and signed the attached compulsory code of conduct form and their behaviour does not require a risk assessment under our Discipline and Welfare Policy.
