On Wednesday students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 will be participating in the NAPLAN Online Practice Tests. The practice tests are designed to help students adapt to answering questions on laptop computers. The results are not kept for these tests, it is just a practice for the technology usage and the type of questions. The actual NAPLAN tests will be held in mid-May. These provide the school with diagnostic results which will help us guide the students learning and improvement in the future.

Parents reading to their children from printed storybooks is very important. New research from paediatric specialists shows that reading from a device or an e-book fails to engage children in the same way as a storybook. Parents and children verbalise and interact more when the story and pictures are in print.

Dr Tiffany Munzer, at the University of Michigan, says that non-verbal interactions, including warmth, closeness and enthusiasm during reading time create positive associations with reading. Coolamon has a great range of books in our library so please encourage your children to borrow and read them.

With plenty of parents and guardians in attendance, our students were well supported on the track which made for some energetic cheering and close race finishes. In another close finish, Millwood wound up the day as house victors, by only a few points in front of Rannock who took the silver and the fast finishing Methul, who were handed the bronze. With Millwood winning two out of our three sports carnivals to date, they are in the box seat to take out the mighty Tom Goss Memorial trophy for best sporting house. RANNOCK

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NAPLAN assesses literacy and numeracy – important skills that each child needs to succeed in school and life. The NAPLAN tests are designed to help us make sure students are on track with their literacy and numeracy development. Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in NAPLAN tests for reading, writing, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

Between 14th and 24th May, our school will participate in NAPLAN Online. Students do not need to be computer experts to take the NAPLAN test online. Making sure students have computer skills is part of our school curriculum, and our teachers will ensure your child is familiar with the online format. To see the types of questions and interactive features of NAPLAN Online, visit <u>the public demonstration site</u>.

To help students become familiar with the platform students will be participating in a 45 minute practice test on Wednesday 3rd April.


Civil Contractors Visit




