
Thanks to all of the students and staff who marched on ANZAC Day. Our numbers were a little lower than usual but a lot of people were away on holidays. The community certainly appreciates that Coolamon Central march on this special day every year.

The NSW Department of Education is supporting the 'Adopt A Farmer' initiative to be held across the nation on Wednesday 8 May 2019. Continuing this good work, there is an ambi-tious goal – to have a gold coin mufti day drive on Wednesday May 8 2019, to raise \$800,000 nationally. All proceeds will go to the farmers. Coolamon CS is supporting this fundraising activity on Wednesday and we encourage the students to donate a gold coin and wear farming clothes for the day.

We are seeking parent cooperation in supporting the sensible use of mobile phones. Students are allowed to use their phones out of class times and only in class with the teacher's permission and for educational outcomes. Evidence shows that it is very important to reduce the amount of time that children spend on their electronic devices at home. Western Sydney University early childhood learning expert Dr Joanne Orlando said "Studies have shown for children who spend long hours on a screen the opportunity to develop language skills is dramatically reduced".

The Blue light emitted by LED and other screens also suppresses the melatonin of children and adds to sleep disruption. This leads to many teenagers having insufficient sleep on school nights which effects their ability to concentrate and learn in class.

Regular attendance at school is essential for students to achieve quality life outcomes. Schools, in partnership with parents, are responsible for promoting the regular attendance of students.

Parents or carers of children of compulsory school age are responsible for ensuring their child attends school every day. Children must commence school by age 6 and then complete year 10. After Year 10 and until they turn 17, students must be:

- in school or registered for home schooling or
- in approved education or training (e.g. TAFE, traineeship, apprenticeship) or
- in full-time, paid employment (average 25 hours/week) or

in a combination of work, education and/or training.

Parents of children from Kindergarten to Year 12 must ensure their children attend school every day. On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- being sick or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday

exceptional or urgent family circumstances e.g. attending a funeral

Parents must provide an explanation for absences to the school within 7 days from the first day of any period of absence. Where an explanation has not been received within the 7-day timeframe, the school will record the absence as unjustified on the student's record.

Library refurbishment


