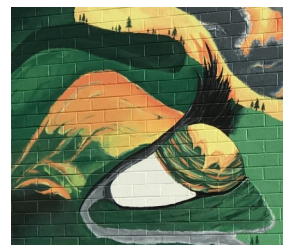

NOMINATIONS

2019 Riverina Central Choir Junior and Senior Division

Primary students in Years 3 to 6 and secondary students Years 7 - 12 that are interested in being nominated for the Riverina Central Choir, please see Mr Szery or Mr Celi by Monday 4th March 2109. Students should be able to sing in tune, hold a separate vocal part in a multi-part harmony situation and consistently demonstrate exemplary rehearsal and performance behaviour. All nominated students will be expected to attend the choir session at South Wagga Public School hall on Wednesday 13th March 2019. The primary session will run from 1.15pm - 3.10pm, secondary students session will run from 4.00pm - 6.00pm. during which time students will be auditioned in groups. A fee of \$15 per student is payable on the day for this session.

A Working With Children Check (WWCC) is a requirement for people who work or volunteer in child-related work, both paid and voluntary.

It involves a national criminal history check and a review of findings of workplace misconduct.

For this reason if you are transporting other people's children to and from excursions and carnivals you will need to have a WWCC number.



Permission notes sent from Coolamon Central School will now have a space for you to write your WWCC number and expiry date. If you do not comply with this, you will be unable to transport other parent's children to and from our school.

That is **Bullying**



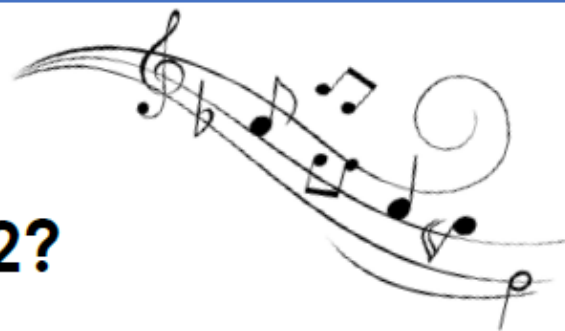
Welcome to Coolamon Central School BBQ

Wellbeing Awards

The K - 12 award system aims to acknowledge great learning and positive behaviour in our classroom and the playground. Once a student has received an award it cannot be taken away from them. The award system will renew annually. All students who behave well and/or learn well regularly will be able to attain the highest level every year.



Great Learning and Positive Behaviour will be acknowledged with:

Junior School Spirit (Year K-9) 20 points
Junior School Spirit awards are presented to students who go above and beyond to do something exceptional for the school and the broader community such as:

- Community Meals
- Bronze Duke of Ed
- Lead a school or community event

Sporting Awards - 5 points

Community and School Service Awards 5 points

Senior Spirit Awards (Year 10-12) 20 points
Senior School Spirit awards are presented to students who go above and beyond to do something exceptional for the school community such as:

- Silver/Gold Duke of Edinburgh
- Leading and organising school and community functions or events,
- Coaching and umpiring a full season of sport,
- Sustained effort in running programs in infants and primary. For example, sporting competitions at lunch (Year 10,11 and 12 students only)

Great Learning & Positive Behaviour Awards 5 points

Students will receive these Awards fortnightly for:

- Consistent great learning and engagement in activities that support the learning of themselves and of others
- Consistent positive behaviour and engagement in activities that supports the well-being of themselves and others
- 100% attendance and very regular wearing of uniform
- Representing CCS School values

Principal's Award – 10 points

Students will receive a Principal's Award for demonstrating consistent application and commitment to learning across all subjects in their semester reports.

Free and Frequent – (Bluey) 1 point - Put their Blueys in the rewards box in the front office where they will be counted towards bronze, silver & gold awards. You will also go in the draw to win prizes. Students will receive these Awards daily for all great learning and positive behaviour that happens in the classroom and the playground. Examples of great learning and behaviour include:

- Being focused in class and follow classroom rules, wear your school uniform
- Give someone a helping hand
- Complete your homework on time and to the best of your ability

Dear Principal,

The Young Endeavour Youth Scheme is pleased to announce that applications are always taken for young Australians aged 16-23 to join a voyage in the national sail training ship *Young Endeavour*.

A voyage in *Young Endeavour* is an exciting experience and a unique opportunity for youth to develop skills for life. Our internationally recognised development program builds self awareness, develops teamwork and leadership skills, and fosters a strong sense of community responsibility.

Since the ship was gifted to Australia in 1988 more than 13,000 young Australians have completed the Young Endeavour Youth Development Program. No sailing experience is required. *Young Endeavour* is operated by a professional Royal Australian Navy crew who ensure the highest standards of safety, and teach participants the skills to sail a square-rigged tall ship.

24 youth from across Australia will join each eleven day voyage during the 2019 program. As members of the crew they will keep watch and take the helm, handle lines on deck, cook in the galley, navigate using the ship's charts, and climb the 30 metre mast to set and furl the sails.

While at sea, they will be encouraged to pursue personal and team goals and challenges. By the end of each voyage they will have the skills and confidence to elect a leadership team and take command of the 44 metre brigantine, sailing *Young Endeavour* along the Australian coast.

Applications are open at www.youngendeavour.gov.au. Voyage fees and conditions will apply to successful applicants, who must be aged 16-23 year on the day of departure of their selected voyage/s. Potential applicants should apply now for the best chance of being drawn for a voyage.

I encourage you to provide this information to students and parents, and to support them in applying for the once in a lifetime opportunity to join a voyage aboard STS *Young Endeavour*. I hope the enclosed posters can be placed on noticeboards around your campus. If you would like to use something in an electronic format, please contact our office so we can help you right away.
