FROM THE PRINCIPAL


















Primary Assembly Award Winners

Code Club and the National Computer Science Challenge


The Coolamon Central School Code Club has reignited this term with a fabulous group of eager students signing up for the annual National Computer Science Challenge. The challenge runs for five weeks and each week students learn new coding skills at an appropriate level for their experience and then apply these skills to complete challenge questions. The challenge is run entirely in an online forum with students able to work through the coding challenges both at school and from home. With one week to go to the challenge, coders are encouraged to continue attending code club at lunchtimes and at home. As a result of the challenge, a group of eager younger junior coders have sprung up and are learning some fun basics with Blockly, coding their own creative monsters.

Parent/Teacher Interviews

Parent/Teacher interview afternoons have been scheduled for Years 7-11 on Tuesday 3rd September and for Kindergarten to Year 6 on Tuesday 17th September. On the day from 3.30 until 6.00pm teachers will be available for interview by appointment. Interviews, which are seven minutes in duration, will be conducted in the school library for both primary and secondary.

To co-ordinate the interviews we have employed an online booking system to assist parents in securing their preferred interview times. The procedure is as follows:

- If you wish to see your child's teacher, you need to secure an appointment time using this system. If you do not have access to the internet, your local library may be able to help, or alternatively, you can call the school office.
- The booking system will only be accessible from today through to Monday 2nd September. No interview requests will be accepted outside of these times.
- Bookings can be made through the school's Parent Portal. This can be accessed through the following URL https://web1.coolamon-c.schools.nsw.edu.au/portal. From Thursday, however we will be transitioning to our new online server which can be found at www.coolamoncs.sentral.com.au.

Teachers may also request an interview with you if they feel there is a matter of importance which should be discussed.

WHAT'S IT ALL ABOUT?



The *Tell Them From Me* student survey (Term 3, 2019)

I am delighted that this term, our school, like many other public schools in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the *Tell Them From Me* student feedback survey. The survey measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

You may remember that our students also participated in a *Tell Them From Me* student survey in Term 1 this year. Asking students to complete the survey twice in one year allows us to identify trends in student responses as well as track engagement and motivation across the school year.

The survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. More than 6,300 schools in Australia and around the world have used *Tell Them From Me* to survey 5.4 million students. Capturing the voices of our students will help improve how we do things at our school.

I want to assure you that the survey is confidential. The survey is conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours between 26 August and 25 October. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary.

If you do not want your child or children to participate, please return the form to school by Monday 2nd September 2019. The Tell Them From Me parent survey (Term 3, 2019)

This Term, our school will be participating in the *Partners in Learning* parent survey, another part of the *Tell Them From Me* suite of surveys (student, teacher and parent surveys) on student engagement. The survey asks parents and carers questions about different factors that are known to impact on student wellbeing and engagement.

Running this survey will help our school understand parents' and carers' perspectives on their child's experience at school. These include: communication between parents/carers and staff, activities and practices at home and parent/carer views on the school's support of learning and behaviour. This valuable feedback will help our school make practical improvements.

The survey is conducted entirely online on smartphones, iPads, tablets, laptops or computers. The survey will typically take 15 minutes or less to complete and is completely confidential. The parent survey will be conducted between 26 August and 25 October. Although participating in the survey is entirely voluntary, your responses are very much appreciated.

Tell Them From Me student survey: Information and consent form for Parents and carers

Dear Parents and Carers

This term, our school is taking part in the *Tell Them From Me* student survey. The survey will provide us with valuable feedback on what our students think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. Schools in Australia and around the world have used the *Tell Them From Me* survey to help them improve. The survey is completed on-line and is run by an independent research company, **The Learning Bar**, which specialises in school-based surveys.

Staff in schools will **not** be able to identify individual students from their responses. To ensure confidentiality, participating students will receive a unique username and password. Where fewer than five students respond to a question, the results will be suppressed. The survey typically takes 30 minutes or less to complete and will be administered by the school during normal school hours. Once the surveys are completed by students, reports are prepared and in most cases are available to schools within three business days.

This survey will help our school better understand how to improve student wellbeing and engagement. It will help the school identify what works to improve student outcomes.

Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary. Your child will not take part if either you or your child do not wish. If, during the survey, your child is uncomfortable, he/she can choose to stop the survey at any time. The majority of questions in the survey can be skipped.

If you <u>do not want</u> your child to take part in the survey, please complete the attached form and return it to your child's school by **Monday 2nd September 2019.**
