Girls



the working with children Check

Do parents need one?

Under the Child Protection (Working with Children) Act 2012, anyone who works or volunteers with children is required to undergo a Working With Children Check. This includes volunteering for school based activities such as Reading Groups, Car Pooling to events including sport and helping out any other school function. It involves a national criminal history check and a review of findings of workplace misconduct.

Getting your WWCC (Working With Children Check) is easy and free for volunteers. Simply go to <u>https://www.kidsguardian.nsw.gov.au/child-safe-organisations/working-with-children-check</u> to

Head Lice infestations occur form time to time in our school.

Effective treatment is essential to break the cycle. To help us try to control head lice, please check your child's hair regularly and treat appropriately, if symptoms occur use the methods recommended in information from the NSW Department of Health.

- Always tie back long hair.
- Keep a fine tooth head lice comb in the bathroom and encourage all family members to use it when they wash their hair.
- Head lice move from one person's head to another via hair.
- Head lice do not survive long when they are off a human head.
- Daily combing of hair with white hair conditioner using a fine tooth comb is effective in getting rid of head lice and eggs.

ANAPHYLAXIS PREVENTION

Anaphylaxis is a severe and sometimes sudden allergic reaction. It can occur when a susceptible person is exposed to an allergen, such as food or insect stings. Reactions usually begin within minutes of exposure and can progress rapidly over a period of up to two hours or more. **Anaphylaxis is potentially life threatening and always requires an emergency response**.

In order to support students at risk of anaphylaxis, we aim to ensure every reasonable effort is made to minimise their exposure to known allergens within the school environment and during school related activities. To further support this, we ask that parents refrain from sending peanuts and all tree nuts to school with their children. This includes peanut butter sandwiches.

Please do not hesitate to contact the school office should you wish to clarify details regarding anaphylaxis and our strategies to minimise its risks. Anaphylaxis is a serious concern, and we thank you in advance for your co-operation.

Dear Year 6 Parent or Carer

The Validation of Assessment for Learning & Individual Development (VALID) test for Year 6 students will be held between **Monday 3 September** and **Friday 14 September 2018**. The test takes approximately 60 minutes. The VALID Science & Technology 6 test is an interactive, multimedia test completed entirely on a computer.

VALID Science & Technology 6 contains multiple choice, short response and extended response tasks that are grouped around real-world issues, including scientific investigations and design problems. This is a diagnostic test, with tasks framed on Stage 3 outcomes and essential content in the NSW Science Years K–10 Syllabus. Students will be tested on their:

- knowledge and understanding of science and technology
- understanding and skills in the process of scientific investigation and design processes
- ability to evaluate evidence, make judgements and think critically
- ability to access information and communicate scientific ideas.

Students also complete a survey about their opinions, attitudes and values about science and technology.

Since students complete VALID Science & Technology 6 on a computer, each student needs to bring **headphones or earbuds** that plug into a school computer. Earbuds for an iPod or portable player are suitable.

If your child has a disability that needs special consideration or has been educated in English for less than one year, please contact your child's school to discuss special provisions or possible exemption from the test.

Results of the test will be available during Term 4 2018. Information about each student is treated confidentially and held securely to ensure that the right to privacy of all students is maintained. A personal report for each student will be sent to parents/carers to describe the knowledge and skills demonstrated by the student in the test. There will also be information about how your child's results compare with overall performance of all students in the test across NSW.

The principal of your child's school is able to provide you with more details about the VALID program if you require additional information.
