Aspire Class 2019





10.58am - The Ode recited by Mr. David McCann


10.59am – Last Post is sounded

Coolamon Central School will be moving to three houses from 2019 onwards instead of the current two. This means that the houses of Kindra and Cowabbie will cease to exist. This motion was passed at a whole school executive meeting held on the 29th October 2018.

This decision was not made lightly. Like all decisions, this was made in the best interests of developing our students into lifelong learners, as well as considering the invested school community members at Coolamon Central School.

The names of the houses will be discussed and decided at an executive level, after input from the school community. This will involve allowing parents, students and staff to be part of the process of forming houses over the coming weeks, with a result by Week 6. House colours and student distribution into houses will also be decided upon at an executive level, after staff consultation.

Within each house, students will be afforded more opportunities to undertake leadership responsibilities. Senior students will be given a chance to nominate as a captain or vice captain and junior students provided the opportunity to be a 'sport representative' for their year in their nominated house. This group of students will form an 'executive' house committee, which will meet with Mr Besgrove on a regular basis during the term.

The idea of just being a 'sport' house will also be challenged under this new structure. The new houses will be explicitly linked to our wellbeing 'bluey' system. This will help determine the overall house winner for the school year.

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It is important to acknowledge that both Kindra and Cowabbie will still remain an important part of our school history and tradition, as without both these houses, the opportunity to move forward and further improve would simply not be possible.
