Crossroads is designed to help senior students address issues of health, safety and wellbeing at a time when they face significant changes and challenges in their lives. Crossroads aims to prepare and support these students as they encounter situations related to identity, independence and their changing responsibilities.

The Rotary Club of Coolamon funded the hire of a driving simulator from Young to support the implementation of the crossroads program and to raise awareness for students within our shire around driver safety.



Students in Years 10 and 11 had the

opportunity to simulate the effects of driving while intoxicated to understand the dangers and the effects on a driver while being completely safe, and also experienced the difficulties of using a mobile device while driving. This occurred over two days with members of both Young and Coolamon Rotary facilitating the simulations. The lessons on the simulator are designed to improve skills of all drivers, young and older and has been proven to heighten the awareness of safety issues. It was an outstanding resource and I would like to thank the Coolamon Rotary Club for their support

towards our school and the youth of Coolamon.



ANAPHYLAXIS PREVENTION



Anaphylaxis is a severe and sometimes sudden allergic reaction. It can occur when a susceptible person is exposed to an allergen, such as food or insect stings. Reactions usually begin within minutes of exposure and can progress rapidly over a period of up to two hours or more. **Anaphylaxis is potentially life threatening and always requires an emergency response**.

In order to support students at risk of anaphylaxis, we aim to ensure every reasonable effort is made to minimise their exposure to known allergens within the school environment and during school related activities. To further support this, we ask that parents refrain from sending peanuts and all tree nuts to school with their children. This includes peanut butter sandwiches.

Please do not hesitate to contact the school office should you wish to clarify details regarding anaphylaxis and our strategies to minimise its risks. Anaphylaxis is a serious concern, and we thank you in advance for your co-operation.

Tell Them From Me student survey: Information and consent form for parents and carers

Dear Parents and Carers

This term, our school is taking part in the *Tell Them From Me* student survey. The survey will provide us with valuable feedback on what our students think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. Schools in Australia and around the world have used the *Tell Them From Me* survey to help them improve. The survey is completed on-line and is run by an independent research company, **The Learning Bar**, which specialises in school-based surveys.

Staff in schools will <u>not</u> be able to identify individual students from their responses. To ensure confidentiality, participating students will receive a unique username and password. Where fewer than five students respond to a question, the results will be suppressed. The survey typically takes 30 minutes or less to complete and will be administered by the school during normal school hours. Once the surveys are completed by students, reports are prepared and in most cases are available to schools within three business days.

This survey will help our school better understand how to improve student wellbeing and engagement. It will help the school identify what works to improve student outcomes.

Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary. Your child will not take part if either you or your child do not wish. If, during the survey, your child is uncomfortable, he/she can choose to stop the survey at any time. The majority of questions in the survey can be skipped.

If you do not want your child to take part in the survey, please complete the attached form and return it to your child's school by Tuesday 16th October 2018.


