from the Principal

Important School Policies & Reminders

As we begin the school year, I'd like to remind students and families about a few key rules and regulations that help keep our school running smoothly.

1. NSW Department of Education – New Behaviour Policy 2024

The **NSW Department of Education introduced a new Behaviour Policy in 2024.** This policy strengthens the **Principal's ability** to ensure a **safe and productive learning environment** for all students. It explicitly addresses the use of mobile phones, vapes, social media, smoking, violence and bullying.

2. Mobile Phone Policy

o Years 7-12: "Off and away" – No phones should be visible or used during school hours.

o **Kindergarten - Year 6:** Students are not permitted to have a mobile phone or smart watch connected to a carrier service while at school.

3. Before & After School Supervision and Parent Access

- Morning Drop-Off:
- o Students should **not arrive before 8:40 AM**, as staff supervision begins at this time.
- o Afternoon Pick-Up:

o Supervision after school is **only provided in the bus area.** Students should exit the school grounds **promptly** at the end of the school day.

- o If a student has issues with pick-up, they should go to the office immediately.
- o Parental Access:
- o We ask parents to limit entering the school grounds for pick-up/drop-off.

o **New students may need time to settle in,** so we encourage parents to establish a **routine for collecting children at the school gate.**

- o Other Reminders:
- o Dogs are not permitted on school grounds.

o **Parents who need to see children or meet teachers** should enter via the **front office** or call to schedule an appointment.

4. Communication Options

We continue to use **Sentral** as our primary communication tool, allowing emails and SMS notifications to parents.

- The Sentral Parent Portal and App are valuable tools for both parents and staff.
- Our Facebook page is a great source for school updates and community engagement.
- Class DoJo is used in Primary classes only for tracking student achievements and rewards it should not be used to contact teachers or exchange information about students.

5. School Costs & Uniform

All school payments will now be managed through the **School Bytes** finance platform, allowing for easier online payments and expense tracking.

- We will provide further details on **school contributions and subject costs** in the coming weeks.
- We recognize the impact of the rising cost of living and have not increased any school fees.
- If you are facing financial difficulties, please **contact me as soon as possible** so we can work together to ensure no student misses out due to financial constraints.



The NSW Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) for 2025 will commence on Monday 24 February. The Challenge aims to encourage a love of reading in students and to enable them to experience quality literature. It is not a competition but a challenge to each student to read, to read more and to read more widely.

The PRC is open to all NSW students from Kindergarten to Year 10, and does not close until Friday 22 August.

Entering the PRC is simple. Just go to the Premier's Reading Challenge website and register your name. <u>www.premiersreadingchallenge.nsw.edu.au</u> Each time you finish a book, log it on the online entry form – the school does the rest. Details about how many books you need to read are in the table below:

Re-Visit the Library


The Library is continuously receiving new books, DVD's, and magazines, come and re-visit the Library - Join the Library today - membership is FREE.
