Aaron de Haan recently enjoyed every part of his music excursion with Riverina Central Choir for Southern Stars in Wollongong, followed by In Concert in Sydney.

Southern Stars Arena Spectacular - Aaron was a part of the massed choir rehearsing their 20 songs and choralography for two days prior to performing in four concerts at the Wollongong Entertainment Centre. As well as singing in the gallery, the 500 strong choir also sang and performed on the Arena floor for two of the items.
