From the Principal

Welcome back to Term 4, traditionally a busy term and it looks to be the same this year. As the first newsletter for the term and the first after Mr Beer's departure on well earnt leave, it is important to communicate some staffing changes. I will be relieving in the role of Principal for all of Term 4 2022 and Term 1 2023. Mr Atkins will move to the role of Deputy Principal. The role of Head Teacher English/HSIE will be shared between Mrs Mazzocchi and Mrs Vogt. I thank them all for their willingness and leadership in these roles.

Some other staffing changes: welcome back to Mrs Taber who returns from maternity leave. Also, a warm welcome to Ms Knight who will replace Mrs Besgrove while she is on maternity leave. Additionally, we have a new staff member in secondary, Mr Blomfield. He will be taking over some classes in PE and assisting in some Technology classes during Term 4.

The HSC is well under way, and we wish all our hard-working students the best as they undertake this final stage of their schooling journey. Exams finish on the 4th of November, and we look forward to celebrating with Year 12 and their families on the 8th of November at the formal.

I would like to take this opportunity to notify you of a change in our student reporting. The final student reports for 2022 will we emailed to parents and uploaded to the Sentral parent portal. Printed copies can be requested for families who do not have access to these electronic platforms. Staff look forward to being able to teach classes and assess student progress for longer with the time saved from the printed hard copy process.

School improvements continue around CCS. Recently, we have finished the final stage of fencing around the school's Agriculture Facility, making it a safer and up to date learning environment for both students, staff and animals. Another project we have just completed was the upgrade of some shade/blinds outside the hall and on the side of the Primary cola. This should allow us to make better use of these spaces in extreme weather conditions and provide a safer option for students. Our last big change was to change our bell system in the school. We now have a system with greater flexibility to ring bells, emergency alarms or to page students in either the classroom or the playground.

Lastly, can I thank students, staff and parents for their assistance in managing to keep the school working as normal in recent weeks with the repeated power outages. Unfortunately, we have another outage scheduled for this Thursday the 27th October.

I look forward to the challenge of leading Coolamon Central School in the coming Terms and building on the positive culture with a clear focus on student growth in what is already a great school community.

Stage 4 Science


Stage 4 Science students busy dissecting chicken wings to learn about muscles, cartilage, ligaments and tendons as part of their body systems unit.



Our local family History group will meet again at the Library Saturday 29th October @ 10.30am – everyone is most welcome.


