Stage 3 Canberra Excursion

Another of those events that leaves a long lasting memory in the minds of students as they move through school is the Stage 3 excursion. It has been a little while now that students have been able to travel away so there was a lot of excitement. This year students travelled to Canberra to supplement the History unit, 'Becoming a Nation' where they explored Federation and the origins of parliament as well as discussing our current system of government.

As soon as we arrived in Canberra we made our way to The Australian War Memorial. Many of us found that we did not have enough time to explore all the fascinating things that there were to see and said that they would definitely go back at a different time. After the War Memorial we visited the National Museum of Australia and the National Capital Exhibition. Both of these were very informative about the history of Canberra and its surrounds.

Although these places were very interesting, most students were holding out for our time at Questacon. This was extra special as we didn't have to share our space with anyone else. There was a lot of fun to be had (particularly on the big slide) and plenty of money was spent at the gift shop (thanks mums and dads).

After an eventful night staying in Narrabundah, students were up and ready to go early, eager for their next experience. Parliament House was next – both old and new. Students enjoyed seeing where the 'big decisions' are made and participated enthusiastically during a roleplay demonstrating how a bill is passed in parliament. After exploring how the voting system works and having oranges win the election, it was time to come home. There were many exhausted passengers meaning the trip home was definitely quieter than on the way out the day before.

The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government is contributing funding of \$30 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs. The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion.
