Year 11 Business Studies recently went on an excursion to two different Wagga businesses: Dough Rei Me and Flipscreen. As the pictures show, they had a great time.













External Assessments

NAPLAN has now ended for another year, with the testing window closing today. Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 completed four assessment tasks in literacy and numeracy. With the assessments being held earlier this year, data from them will become available sooner, allowing it to be used more effectively in the planning process. Once the results become available, the school will distribute the information to parents.

The next external assessments will be Check In Assessments for Years 4, 6 and 8 and will be held between Weeks 4-7 next term. These will also be assessing both literacy and numeracy knowledge and skills.



New Syllabus Implementation K-2

This term, students in Garnet, Emerald, Opal and Sapphire have been engaged in activities designed to address the outcomes from the new English and Mathematics syllabus. With all things new, there has been a lot of discussion around the correct approach and how best to meet the needs of all students. Teachers have been working collaboratively to deliver units based on quality literature and a variety of concrete materials. Saver Plus is a financial education program for families and individuals on a tight budget to develop life-long savings habits.

To join Saver Plus, you must:

Card AND an eligible Centrelink payment*

Be studying yourself OR have a child in school (can be starting school next year)

Have regular income from work (either yourself or your partner)*

*Many types of income and Centrelink payments are eligible

Now is the time to claim ABSTUDY for your high school child



ABSTUDY is a group of payments for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australians. ABSTUDY helps with the costs of studying or doing an Australian Apprenticeship.

It can help with your child's school fees, boarding costs, travel to and from school and other school items. If your child's travel is impacted by COVID-19 or they need to study remotely, ABSTUDY can also help.

If you're a parent or guardian and your child is younger than 16, you should claim on their behalf. If your child is 16 and over, or independent, they can claim themselves. To claim, call the Services Australia's ABSTUDY line on Freecall 1800 132 317.

If they're starting uni or TAFE, they'll be able to claim online through myGov.

Claiming before 1 December means ABSTUDY payments can be finalised in time for the start of school next year. This is very important if your child needs to move away from home to study.

Lego Club


