Science and Digital Technology

This term, students from Kindergarten to Year 6 have had the opportunity to utilise a range of robotics as part of their Science and Digital Technology lessons.

Using Bee Bots students are developing programming, logic and spatial orientation skills. Students experimented with programming by using the buttons on the robot's clear shell and remotely, using Blue-Tooth technology via the iPads.

Furthermore, students utilised the Lego WeDO 2.0 where they are challenged to explore a topic, create or model a solution, and share their findings with one another.



Both the Bee Bots and Lego WeDo encourages open ended problem solving and exploration while having fun!

What is the Mathematics Growth Team?

The Mathematics Growth Team, a part of the Best In Class Teaching Unit, amplifies the impact of expert Mathematics teaching at targeted schools to:

- strengthen Mathematics leaders and build a new generation of Mathematics teachers across NSW public schools
- support the use of evidence-based, best-practice assessment and teaching practices among mathematics educators.

Currently, the Mathematics Growth Team (MGT) consists of 10 school-based expert Mathematics Secondary teachers. **Mr Pollard** is the trainer based at Coolamon Central School

Lesson studies and observations

As part of the evaluation of the Mathematics Growth Team project, Mathematics lessons across the school will have teacher demonstration and teaching recorded for the purpose of evaluation. These recordings are shared securely with the research team and any incidental capturing of students will not be published. Mr Pollard has been provided with video recording equipment and will be conducting these lesson observations late Term One and early Term Two.



World of Maths - Hands on Maths Workshops

As part of this term's learning, we have invited World of Maths (a travelling, interactive Mathematics Workshop) to visit our school.

World of Maths offers an ideal opportunity for students to see how Maths is applied to everyday life situations and explore in a hands-on environment.

Students are encouraged to communicate their Mathematical ideas and answers with other students in small teams, working together.

Students will gain insight into problem solving, working in teams, and explore various Mathematics concepts which are part of their curriculum this term.

It is a highly engaging session which will show that Mathematics is everywhere and of course that it can be fun!

NAPLAN 2021

NAPLAN assesses Literacy and Numeracy – important skills that each child needs to succeed in school and life. The NAPLAN tests are designed to help us make sure students are on track with their literacy and numeracy development. Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in NAPLAN tests for reading, writing, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

Between 11th and 21st May, our school will participate in NAPLAN Online. Students do not need to be computer experts to take the NAPLAN test online. Making sure students have computer skills is part of our school curriculum, and our teachers will ensure your child is familiar with the online format.
