Book Fair will be at CCS Term 2, Week 3



Students will gain insight into problem solving, working in teams and explore various Mathematics concepts which are part of their curriculum this term.


It is a highly engaging session which will show that Mathematics is everywhere and of course that it can be fun!

4. Featured Artists, Backing Vocalists, Featured Dancers, Core Choir, Featured Instrumentalists and VET Entertainment Work Placement applications will need to complete the online endorsement form following submitting their application form. A link to the endorsement form will be sent to the students' parent/carer via email.



Surround Sound is a band competition for students from secondary schools in rural and remote areas.

Bands must have between 3 and 16 members and may perform covers or originals in any style of contemporary music.

All performers must be students currently enrolled at a NSW public school in Years 7 to 12. No teachers or tutors can perform as part of the band.

Round 1 will be held by video submission.

Schools chosen as finalists will be visited by an industry mentor for a workshop at a time to be negotiated.

Finalists will prepare a 15 minute set for a performance at a live event in Sydney in Term 4. Song choice will be subject to copyright advice. Bands will be supported to travel to Sydney and accommodated for their performance at the final.

You must live in regional or rural NSW outside of Sydney, Newcastle and Wollongong and be one of the following:


- Receiving the age pension
