Stage 3 students had an incredible time last week consolidating their knowledge of The Gold Rush, one of the units studied this semester in History. They started their adventures touring the Port of Echuca and enjoying a leisurely cruise down the Murray River on a paddle steamer. Once in Ballarat, they spent the second day exploring Sovereign Hill, discovering the properties of gold and learning all about the making of candles that lit the narrow passageways in the mines. There were plenty of activities to do including panning for gold. A lucky few struck gold! The Aura light show was next which shared the history of gold as well as its discovery in Ballarat, followed by the subsequent expansion of the community into the bustling town that it is today. Exploring an old mine in Bendigo 61m below the ground topped off an amazing three days.





