I would like to ask all parents and carers to help us in

keeping the school a pleasant and healthy place to work in. Personal hygiene is extremely important, particularly in the hot weather we have been experiencing. We have ample spare clothing in our share the wear clothing pool. Also, as winter approaches it is important that students regularly wash their hands, or use the hand sanitiser that we provide, to help prevent the spread of colds and flu. The school will be paying for staff influenza vaccinations to help keep us healthy.

I would like to warn parents about dangerous and controversial social media platform known as Tik Tok. Many students have been physically and emotionally injured after becoming involved in this. Cyber safety experts are warning parents to delete the hugely popular video sharing app. The NSW eSafety Commisioner Julia Inman Grant said "Tik Tok can become a platform for unsavoury behaviours like cyber bullying, image-based abuse and grooming by paedophiles".

Education experts recognise that improving writing skills is very important in accelerating student growth and achievement. The school has paid for a Professional Learning Day for the whole teaching staff with a specialised provider, Seven Steps for Writing. In order for this to take place next term we have had to alter our Term 2 Staff Development Day. **The first day of term, Monday April 27<sup>th</sup> will now be a normal school day with all students expected to attend. Friday May 1<sup>st</sup> will now be our Staff Development Day and as such a pupil free day.**

# **Super Problem Solving**

Every Thursday students in Mrs Taber's Maths group participate in Super Problem Solving. During the lessons students are encouraged to work independently or in small groups to solve mathematical word problems, consolidating learning experiences they have been taught throughout the week.

Here is an example word problem that was tricky to solve. Can you solve it?

The total air fares of a family of 2 adults and 3 children was \$5600. How much was each child's air fare if it was half of the adult fare?



ANSWER: \$800 PER CHILD



The NSW Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) for 2020 commences on Monday 2 March. The Challenge aims to encourage a love of reading in students and to enable them to experience quality literature. It is not a competition but a challenge to each student to read, to read more and to read more widely.

The PRC is open to all NSW students from Kindergarten to Year 9, and does not close until Friday 28 August.

Entering the PRC is simple. Just go to the Premier's Reading Challenge website and register your name. Each time you finish a book, log it on the online entry form - school does the rest. Details about how many books you need to read are in the table below:

## **Morning & Afternoon Supervision**
