from The Principal

Unfortunately, due to the COVID restrictions we will not be able to hold face to face Parent/Teacher evenings this term. We are hoping that the Education Department may alter these conditions in the near future. These restrictions also prevent us from having parents/carers attending our school assemblies. I appreciate the effort that everybody has put in to help keep us all safe.



Our staff will continue Management of Actual or Potential Aggression (MAPA) training on the evening of March 9th. This training event will replace the scheduled Staff Development Day on December 17th. Coolamon Central School will finish school on Thursday December 16th.

As I have previously mentioned, the staff have been working on our new 2021-2024 School Improvement Plan over the past few months. We are concentrating on three Strategic Directions to help improve the learning outcomes and wellbeing of our students.

These directions are:

- 1: Student Growth and Attainment
- 2: Quality Teaching
- 3: Wellbeing for All

Coolamon Central like other NSW public schools, has been provided with finance to employ extra staff to build literacy and numeracy skills, which some students have found difficult due to the COVID on line learning period. Our Learning and Support Teams are working with many of our students in small group situations to build these skills.

Mr Pollard has been appointed as part of a specialised Maths Growth Team to assist teachers in building their students numeracy skills. The leader of the state team, Mr Eddie Woo, has said that rote learning (such as the times tables) was a precursor to mastering trickier numerical concepts. He went on to say that "being able to recall facts quickly is a foundation for deeper thinking." This is where you as parents and carers can assist by making sure that your children memorise the mathematical tables.

I would like to ask for your support in reminding your children to come straight to school in the morning. Unfortunately, there have been complaints made about students loitering in Redgrave Park in the morning and using loud unacceptable language. I have spoken to all of our students about this. Child Studies




Child Studies students are learning about the different care requirements of a newborn. They had the opportunity to practice bathing, feeding and swaddling a 7 month old in class last week.

Online Enrolment Project

We are excited to announce we will be are rolling out the new Online Enrolment System from Monday 15 March 2021

The Online Enrolment System is designed to provide flexibility for our parents to submit an enrolment application online and at the time that best suits you. The application can be accessed on all browsers and mobile devices including iOS and Android.

The online application process is currently restricted to:

- Enrolments into local schools only
- Children who are Australian citizens, New Zealand citizens or permanent residents
- Children who live in NSW.

We offer our support and encourage you to complete your application to enrol online. If, however, you do not feel comfortable completing an application online, a paper copy will be available for collection from the front office or can be downloaded from the Department's going to a public school site.

Transport for NSW is seeking to improve the consistency and accuracy of bus service information across New South Wales. As part of this state wide program, bus route names and numbers are being amended so they can become part of a standardised system. These changes will apply to all buses that operate to and from our school, effective 1st March 2021.

Note that these are route name/number changes only. Physical routes (or paths) along which school buses operate will not be affected.

Schedule of route service changes

This shows old bus numbers and corresponding new names/numbers.

To help students and teachers clearly identify services and become familiar with the changes, there will be a transition period during which each bus will display its old route name/number next to the new one.

ACTIVE KIDS VOUCHER

IS YOUR CHILD READY TO GET ACTIVE IN 2021?

Don't forget that the NSW Government is helping kids get active with the Active Kids program.

The **Active Kids** program provides **two** \$100 vouchers for parents, guardians and carers of school-enrolled children to use towards sport and active recreation costs each year.

- VOUCHER 1 is valid January to December 2021
- VOUCHER 2 is valid July to December 2021

To use the voucher, find a registered activity provider and present your voucher when you sign up.

<u>Eligibility</u>

If you're a parent, carer or guardian, the student will be eligible if they are:

- a NSW resident aged between 4.5 and 18 years
- enrolled in school (from Kindergarten to Year 12, including those who are home-schooled or enrolled in secondary school education at TAFE NSW)
- a current Medicare card holder.

You can apply for a voucher for each eligible student.

What you need

- a MvServiceNSW account
- · one proof of identity document
- your child's Medicare card details
- your child's height and weight (optional)
