Coolamon Central School Wellbeing System

Coolamon Central School's Wellbeing System is based on the school's core values:



Students receive "bluey" awards daily for great learning and positive behaviour that happens in the classroom and the playground in line with our core values.

Primary students accumulate points via paper blueys and dojo points online. Each fortnight one value is made the focus. Students who have received blueys for the focused value go into a fortnightly raffle drawn at assembly. All dojos and blueys are added to Sentral.

Secondary students are awarded blueys from teachers for demonstrating the three values. Once they have a set of five in one colour, they have them stapled and handed into the mailbox in the office. These are then counted to add to Sentral. A draw (2 of each value) is completed at assembly every fortnight.

For all CCS students, these points accumulate towards Bronze, Silver, Gold, Platinum and Opal Awards and contribute to the overall house points.

<u>Class Awards – 5 Points</u> - Students will receive these awards fortnightly at assembly and are based on effort, application or achievement in different subject areas.

Primary teachers choose three students to receive class awards each fortnight. **Secondary** teachers choose a number of students to receive awards based on overall class size, e.g. three to every ten.

<u>Principal's Award – 10 Points</u> Primary classes are rostered and the class teacher, in consultation with the principal, choose one recipient per fortnight.

Secondary students will receive a Principal's Award for demonstrating consistent application and commitment to learning across all subjects in their semester reports. These are handed out at presentation night.

Wellbeing Levels and Rewards

As students are allocated blueys, they progress through different wellbeing levels. Students are awarded certificates and rewards at assemblies, based on the level that they have achieved. The idea is to reward students with something that supports their schooling.

Boorowa Central Schools Touch











