Coolamon Central School has secured staff funding to create an extra class for this year. The class, Year 2/3 Amber, will commence at the beginning of Term 2. Amber's creation will have a positive impact on several of our existing classes, the most exciting of all being reduced class sizes. Smaller student numbers allow teachers to give more individual attention to each child, and as a result, improve student learning outcomes. We are pleased to announce Mr Khalili will be the Year 2/3 Amber teacher, and the lessons will take place in the library's main classroom.

I would like to ask all parents/carers to support the school in ensuring that their children use their mobile phones and electronic devices appropriately. 


I am grateful for all the things I have, especially for the animals. because we need to protect them. They are beautiful. Maddisyn

NAPLAN assesses literacy and numeracy – important skills that each child needs to succeed in school and life. The NAPLAN tests are designed to help us make sure students are on track with their literacy and numeracy development. Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in NAPLAN tests for reading, writing, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

Between 11<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> May, our school will participate in NAPLAN Online. Students do not need to be computer experts to take the NAPLAN test online. Making sure students have computer skills is part of our school curriculum, and our teachers will ensure your child is familiar with the online format. To see the types of questions and interactive features of NAPLAN Online, visit <u>the public demonstration site</u>.

To help students become familiar with the platform students will be participating in a 45 minute practice test on 25<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> March.

We request that if possible students bring their own set of headphones to use during the tests.

### **Family History Group**


Our local family history group is meeting at the Library, Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> March @10.15am. Enjoy family history – come along.
