As you would be aware the information surrounding Coronavirus is constantly changing. There is a lot of misleading and contradictory information, particularly on social media, in regard to the Coronavirus. We will be following the official information as supplied to us by the Department of Education and the Department of Health in relation to COVID-19.

Maintaining healthy work environments

"I would like to stress that the single best way to protect ourselves from the spread of any respiratory infection is to maintain good hygiene standards:

- 1. Practice regular, 20-second hand washing with soap and water.
- Cough or sneeze into your elbow or better still a tissue (and dispose of it immediately)
- 3. Stay at home if you are sick."

Please see the detailed **Schools to implement distancing measures** in this newsletter. All classrooms have been provided with hand sanitiser for student use. We will be following Department guidelines and sending home any member of staff or student who shows signs of being unwell. Parents and children should also consider medical advice in regard to vaccinations for the influenza virus.

I would like to ask all parents/carers to allow and encourage their children participate fully in the *Tell Them From Me (TTFM)* online survey. This is a valuable tool that provides feedback to the school on what we are doing well and what we can do better. A letter will go home to all parents/ carers with more details about this.

Students in Years 5,7 & 9 will be undertaking the NAPLAN practise tests which start on Monday March 23rd. The actual NAPLAN tests will be carried out in May. Students should not feel pressured by this testing, as it as a means of finding out where their strengths and weaknesses lie in numeracy and literacy. This allows us to provide individual assistance or extensions where it is required.

Our students have represented the school in a lot of different sports over the last two weeks. These include; swimming, AFL, cricket, touch football. Thanks to all of the staff and parents who have helped with these teams. Some of our students have been very successful in making regional and state teams. The Primary have enjoyed the activities in the Hot Shot's tennis program.

Unfortunately, we are postponing the Parent /Teacher nights until next term. All students will be given a note today updating the present situation. If there are any further developments affecting Coolamon Central School you will be notified by school notes and on Facebook.

The NSW Department of Education is introducing proactive measures to limit the impact of novel coronavirus (COVID-19) in our schools.

Mark Scott, Secretary of the Department of Education, today announced that schools would adopt social distancing measures requiring them to cancel assemblies, excursions, travel, some events and conferences.

Mr Scott said these measures are precautionary and designed to reduce exposure via non-essential gatherings.

"Schools have been a focus of the community and the government as the impacts of coronavirus have developed globally," Mr Scott said.

"From Monday onwards, I expect school assemblies and substantial gatherings to be cancelled, along with all excursions.

"The community expects schools to be as safe as possible. We are implementing these measures to provide peace of mind for students, parents and staff."

"These cancellations also extend to inter-school arts, sports, initiative activities and events.

All major arts, sports and initiative activities and events will temporarily be ceased until further notice. This includes whole-school sporting events and inter-school events involving three or more schools.

"Local inter-school sport and other activities can proceed, but we ask organisers to ensure that as far as possible, reasonable precautions are taken," Mr Scott said.

"I trust our principals and staff to show leadership during this time."

Schools will be provided with more detailed advice and suggestions on how they can adjust their day to day activities with minimal disruption.

The department is continuing to prepare for further closures if necessary with scaling up of technology, additional training of staff and preparation of offsite lessons.

During week 10, this term, our school, like many other public schools in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the *Tell Them From Me* student feedback survey. The survey measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

The survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide us

with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. More than 6,300 schools in Australia and around the world have used *Tell Them From Me* to survey 5.4 million students. Capturing the voices of our students will help improve how we do things at our school.

I want to assure you that the survey is confidential. The survey is conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours between Monday 30th March and Friday 3rd April. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary.

A consent form and FAQs for parents/carers about the survey is being sent home with students. If you <u>do</u> <u>not</u> want your child or children to participate, please return the form to school by Thursday 26th March. CHS Riverina Swimming Carnival

On Monday the 2nd of March, 21 secondary swimmers travelled to Leeton to compete in the Combined High Schools Riverina Swimming Carnival. Effort and participation levels were high, in particular amongst our junior students and all students did a fabulous job at ensuring they marshalled for their events on time. Coolamon Central is very proud of the effort of all students on the day but special mentions must be made for several swimmers. Lennard Stone had a red hot go at six events, narrowly missing out on a berth at state, finishing an impressive fourth in the 12 years Boys 200m and 100m freestyle. Noah Hatty also impressed, placing fourth in three of his seven swims, dazzling bystanders with his swims in the 14 years Boys 200m freestyle, 50m freestyle and the 100m butterfly.

This year with an abundance of talented female junior swimmers we were able to enter the 13 years and 14 years 4 x 50m freestyle relay events. The 13 years team consisting of Eva Lucas, Allie Delaney, Olivia Crocker and Olivia Walker. The team raced home with a strong finish and placed an impressive fourth against super school Murrumbidgee Regional College, Temora High School and Leeton High School. Our 14 years Girls relay team consisting of Chloe Clark, Lacey Harris, Isabella Stuart and Abigail Crocker swam an impressive time of 2 minutes 31 seconds and again, gave much larger schools a competitive race. The Mixed Central Schools 4 x 50m Freestyle Relay team consisting of Bethany Crocker, Summer Buchegger, Peter McCallum and Benjamin Dennis were our most successful relay team on the day. They raced through the water to hit the wall with a convincing first place against Hillston, Barellan and Coleambally Central Schools, breaking the previous record by held by Coleambally by one second in a time of 2 minutes and eight seconds.

Our twelve year old girls impressed on the day with Prue Clancy qualifying for State with a massive personal best time and a third place in the 100m freestyle. Swimmer of the day this year must go to Hannah McDonald who qualified for the Combined High Schools State carnival in six of her seven individual events. Hannah placed first in the 12 years Girls 200m freestyle and shocked herself by winning both 100m freestyle and 50m freestyle from the outside lane. She continued the day with more personal best times and two second place swims in the 100m butterfly and 100m backstroke.

Thank you to all parents and carers who spent the day supporting CCS students with plenty of cheering and assistance with travel.



The NSW Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) for 2020 commenced on Monday 2 March. The Challenge aims to encourage a love of reading in students and to enable them to experience quality literature. It is not a competition but a challenge to each student to read, to read more and to read more widely.

The PRC is open to all NSW students from Kindergarten to Year 9, and does not close until Friday 28 August.

Entering the PRC is simple. Just go to the Premier's Reading Challenge website and register your name. Each time you finish a book, log it on the online entry form - school does the rest. Details about how many books you need to read are in the table below:

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






Students in Stage 4 have been learning about cells in Science. As part of this they prepared their own onion cell slides successfully and observed the cells with light microscopes.


